

“Irish Place Names” Volunteer Information

▶▶▶ Carefully Read and Follow These Instructions ◀◀◀

Please advise the person who volunteers after you to read these as well.

- Read the information board about Irish place names so you have an understanding of what “place names” means.
- Use the picture cards to learn what different Irish place names mean.
- Look on the maps to find example place names.
- People of all ages are welcome to participate.
- Make sure each participant older than 5 has a green or orange wristband. If not, politely inform them that they need to purchase a wristband at the festival entrance to participate in any festival activities.
- When people need help or have questions, help/answer them in a polite & friendly way so every has fun and feels welcome.
- In order to earn a shamrock sticker, a person needs to return the worksheet with one side completed with correct answers – there is an answer key. If an answer is incorrect, give them a hint as to where to find the correct answer. If they finish with both sides correct, they get two shamrock stickers.
- If all their answers are complete and correct, use a pen to put a star on the top of the side of the sheet that they have finished and they can choose a shamrock. **The participant can take their sheet if they want it.**
- If you are on the 4-6 pm volunteer shift, between 5-6 pm, pack up all the items on this table in the box. When you finish, go to one of the tables that didn't need a volunteer, and pack up those items in its box.
- When the next volunteer arrives to take your place, share hints or wisdom you acquired during your shift.
- Return your Volunteer Badge to the Check-in table.
